The deans will participate in a conference entitled "Taking the Lead -- The Deans Summit on Education for a Technological World," which is slated for 1-2 October in Baltimore, Maryland, USA. SCOPE 4: Address ways to improve the climate for women in IEEE and the workplace.

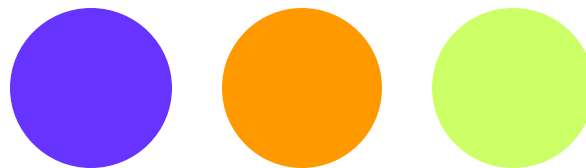
